Russian Government Defined Aircraft and Related Equipment Procurement of Which Requires Prior Approval

July 30, 2018

As we have **previously** reported, with effect from June 30, 2018, Russian stateowned companies must obtain approval from the Government Import Substitution Commission in order to procure certain goods, including aircraft.

According to the new Order of the Russian Government No. 1489-r dated July 18, 2018 such approval is required for the procurement of:

- Aircraft if the contract price starts above RUB 200 million (approximately USD 3 million)
- Propulsion systems, engines, stationary flight simulators and their parts – if the contract price starts above RUB 5 million (approximately USD 80,000)

As expected, procurement of almost any type of foreign aircraft currently operated in Russia, including business jets, now requires this approval.
